DEAF CIRCLE TRAINING

The Archdiocese of Santa Fe Office of Pastoral Outreach Deaf Circle is hosting a weekly zoom meeting designed to assist interpreters who are currently interpreting the Roman Catholic Mass.

This weekly training/meeting is designed for interpreters of all levels. We are fortunate to have a deaf priest from the Diocese of Milwaukee (Fr. Christopher Klusman) who will assist with the spiritual guidance involved in the training.

We will study the readings together for each of the Sunday Liturgies and alternate interpreting using linguistic tactics and peer reasoning.

Time will be allotted for discussion questions related to that interpreter's sign choice as we analyze the grammatical structure presented. This type of training/meeting is structured for continued individual growth related to interpreting in a Roman Catholic setting.

THRESHOLDS PROGRAM: MENTOR TRAINING

On **December 3 and 10, 2022** Thresholds will conduct a New Mentor Training Seminar for persons interested in becoming Mentors. Training will occur at the St. Pius X High School Campus, Lourdes Hall, 4060 St Joseph's Place, Room 103 from 9AM - 4PM. Lunch will be provided.

Our Thresholds Mentoring Program is a nondenominational project, sponsored by the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, Office of Pastoral Outreach. The program serves men and women released from prisons and treatment facilities in the state of New Mexico who are returning to Albuquerque or the surrounding community. Our primary purpose is to assist returning citizens (Mentees) improve the transition process from prison to their communities and families and remain out of prison. Volunteers, (Mentors) work together in teams of two or three and offer support in the transition from prison back to the community; only 12 hours a month is expected. Mentors, give guidance and link their Mentee to resources in their communities like housing, employment, training programs, education, clothing, food, legal advocacy, transportation, treatment recovery programs, church, and they will assist with parole concerns or any issue impacting a Mentee. Mentors are spiritual companions who will draw on their faith and life experience to help and accompany Mentees in their return journey home.



The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) is the national anti-poverty program of the US Catholic Bishops.

Each year, the national collection for CCHD is used to provide grants to non-profit organizations that work to break the cycle of poverty through community or economic development projects.



NMAA is a grassroots organization of acequias, with a strong history of working to change laws and structures to protect traditional water rights in our arid ecosystem. Over the years, they have worked to change the process of how water rights are transferred from agricultural use to commercial or development use. They train acequia members to advocate for their acequia rights, and to be a credible voice in the New Mexico State Legislature. After devastating fires in Northern NM, NMAA is working on GPS mapping for flood mitigation post-fire and on water management for small farmers.



ABQ Interfaith (AI) is a broad based, non-partisan and non-profit organization of 15 member institutions from Bernalillo County. Their member institutions include: unions, churches, faith communities, public/charter schools, & non-profit organizations. Al utilizes community organizing strategies to help member institutions develop leaders with the capacity to build a more just society. They currently focus on: Public Education, Immigrant Justice, Neighborhood Safety & Preservation, & Behavioral Health. This year they will train key leaders to address legislative hearings on an increase from the Land Grant Permanent Fund for Early Education funding, the Opportunity Equity Index, keeping schools protected from cuts due to pandemic's impact, the Health Security Act, rebuilt mental health infrastructure and emergency aid to those excluded from stimulus monies. They plan to increase their member institutions in S. Valley and Westside.





La Cosecha CSA, is a community cooperative, known as a community supported agriculture (CSA), owned by nine-local small farmers, and located in Albuquerque's South Valley. Their mission is to provide communities with healthy food access to fresh local produce and nutrition education, while supporting the aggregation of local farmers for a stronger local food production system. Their community development project involves training and mobilizing their CSA members to advocate for policies related to just, equitable, and sustainable healthy food.

Local Grants: 25% of the collection taken in our Archdiocese remains in our Diocese to fund local projects. Local "seed" grants of \$1,500-\$10,000 are available to eligible groups working with the poor to address long-term solutions. CCHD may also match grants from The Catholic Foundation. Local grants are available year-round.

National Grants: The remaining 75% of the collection is pooled with other Dioceses to fund larger national grants. National grants may award \$25,000-\$75,000. A "Pre-Application" to determine National grant eligibility is available September 1st until November 1st at www.usccb.org/cchd/grants. In addition, a portion of the national collection supports USCCB poverty awareness education and CCHD national administration.



They struggle to afford food, housing, transportation, healthcare, utilities and

Together, we live and share the Church's social mission for the common good and the evangelization of the world.

The theme for **CSMG 2023** is **"Blessed are the Peacemakers" (Mt. 5:9)**. This year's



MONTHLY REFLECTION

"Many young people today feel that they have inherited the failed dreams of their parents and grandparents, dreams betrayed by injustice, social violence, selfishness and lack of concern for others. In a word, they feel uprooted. If the young grow up in a world in ashes, it will be hard for them to keep alive the flame of great dreams and projects. If they grow up in a desert devoid of meaning, where will they develop a desire to devote their lives to sowing seeds? The experience of discontinuity, uprootedness and the collapse of fundamental certainties, fostered by today's media culture, creates a deep sense of orphanhood to which we must respond by creating an attractive and fraternal environment where others can live with a sense of purpose." THE ECUMENICAL CORNER November 2022

In the last century, the most powerful ecumenical moments have been the most tragic.

Did you know that in the 20th century, there were more Christian martyrs than in all previous nineteen centuries? Christians – Catholic, Protestant



and Orthodox – throughout the world died, in many cases together, for and in service of their faith in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The example of these men and women gives witness that the Church is much bigger than the denominational walls that have been erected over the centuries.

Their martyrdom "is the highest point of the life of grace, the truest communion possible with Christ...these brothers and sisters of ours, united in the selfless offering of their lives for the Kingdom of God are the most powerful proof that every factor of division can be transcended and overcome in the total gift of self for the sake of the Gospel." (*Ut Unum Sint*)

St. John Paul II, in his address to the Ukrainian community of L'viv in 2001, said "Christians of different confessions have been persecuted and killed for Christ. Their common martyrdom is a powerful calling towards reconciliation and unity. It is the ecumenism of martyrs, witnesses of faith, that shows us the way towards unity of the 21st century Christians."

The ecumenical challenge from these Christian martyrs is...if we - Protestants, Catholics and Orthodox - can die together for Christ, then why can't we live together in Christ?

May all of us as Christians today heed Jesus' prayer the night before *He was killed*, "Father that they be one...so that the world may believe." (John 17:11.21)
